2023 Outreach Roundtable Report

In March of 2023, St. Alban's Outreach Roundtable voted to rename our committee the John Earl Outreach Roundtable, in honor of all the work our John Earl has done within our Parish and our community. The John Earl Outreach Roundtable is made up of a 'Champion' representing each fundraiser and ministry St. Alban's supports. These 'Champions' are each involved in their ministry and responsible for keeping the committee updated on current issues, concerns, plans, and needs for their ministry/fundraiser. Outreach ministries help our community neighbors who are in need of: meals, groceries, shelter, medicine, medical/dental, and other basic needs as well as education for financial/life skills, job searches, and reliable transportation to/from work so they can keep their jobs. Our fundraisers support local & international partners.

LOCAL: GHCCM, The Corner Table, Hickory Soup Kitchen, Habitat for Humanity, Safe Harbor, Our Father's Pavilion, Castle of Cans, and St. Alban's Community Garden INTERNATIONAL: Haiti and Rise Against Hunger Outreach funds come almost entirely from our church fundraisers, so it makes the effort/planning that goes into our fundraising especially important and the volunteers/participants especially appreciated!

Our fundraisers currently include: The Oyster Roast, Yard Sale, Fish Fry, the Giving Tree at Christmas, and the Souper Bowl. All funds raised go directly to our Outreach ministries. With all the volunteer support, donations, and parish/community participation, we have raised over \$8,500 for Outreach this year (2024):

- Oyster Roast over \$7,600.00.
- January's Souper Bowl \$848.00 for our food ministries, Hickory Soup Kitchen and The Corner Table.
- Rise Against Hunger event packed 25,000 meals that will be distributed through the RAH network to those in greatest need around the world.

December's Giving Tree raised \$950 for GHCCM and Episcopal Relief and Development. Upcoming fundraisers for 2024: the Yard Sale, on Saturday, May 11, and the Fish Fry in September. If anyone would like to be involved in putting on our current fundraisers or has a new fundraiser idea they would like to organize, we'd love to have you join us!! Buildings and Grounds

The hard working Buildings and Grounds Committee accomplished much in 2023 to enhance the beauty, safety and accessibility of our campus . The hospitality extended by our lovely welcoming space exemplifies sound stewardship and intentional care. What's not listed is the hours of calling and meeting contractors to obtain quotes, getting and moving materials onsite to complete projects, meetings held to coordinate projects, overseeing the grounds, and fixing "little" items that continually pop. Here a Proper Preface is sung or said on all Sundays, and on other occasions as appointed.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

At the following words concerning the bread, the Celebrant is to hold it or lay a hand upon it; and at the words concerning the cup, to hold or place a hand upon the cup and any other vessel containing wine to be consecrated.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

Celebrant and People Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues

We celebrate the memorial of our redemption, O Father, in this sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving. Recalling his death, resurrection, and ascension, we offer you these gifts.

Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people the Body and Blood of your Son, the holy food and drink of new and unending life in him. Sanctify us also that we may faithfully receive this holy Sacrament, and serve you in unity, constancy, and peace; and at the last day bring us with all your saints into the joy of your eternal kingdom.

All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ. By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN*.

Celebrant And now, as our Savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say,

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The Breaking of the Bread

The Celebrant breaks the consecrated Bread. A period of silence is kept.

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us; *Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia*.

The Communion of the People

Gluten free wafers are available upon request at the altar rail. Two chalices are offered at the altar rail. The first one is offered to those who prefer to drink from the cup. The second chalice follows for those who prefer to intinct (dip) the wafer in the wine before consuming. Please hold the wafer in your open palm to indicate your preference to the server.
